PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In this unit pupils will build on the fundamental skills required to perform at maximum levels in competitive games. Development of the basic principles of attack and defence. In all games activities, pupils are encouraged to think about how to use core skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition.

Changing Sounds

Pupils should be taught to:

- identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating
- recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear
- find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it
- find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it
- recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
