


The Link have been learning about weather conditions and what they look, and sound like to us. **Students have been** completing their AQA animal care units around school including mucking out, feeding and general care. **Children enjoyed** learning about fossils and where they came from. They used salt dough to create their own.

Students were also encouraged to explore and use different musical instruments and sing along to familiar songs.











The Link 2 - Crouch

Link 2 have been "Blown Away" this term. They have learned all about the elements starting with the wind. They have visited local working Windmills, exploring how they harness the wind to produce flour. In cooking and LifeSkills they have focussed on flour as a base and made bread, cakes and different types of shortbread. There has been a maths focus in learning about ratios and amounts in their recipes. The learners have visited a range of shops where they used their premade shopping lists and followed them and learned about bar codes and scanning. They have learned weather related poems in English and completed reading writing and craft tasks around the books Blown Away, Lila and the Secret of the Rain and Little Cloud. **In Science they have made** Windmills, experimented with wind experiments and made a tornado in a jar. **Together we have learned a cool** handshake to demonstrate our class rules of kindness, respect and good listening. OUTDOOR LEARNING FOR LIFE



Outdoor Learning for Life class have braved the storms this term, working very hard in our school outdoor areas on the farm and allotment. The class have helped develop the polytunnel area ready for

Spring, filling the raised beds and planting trees and hedgerows which were kindly donated by The Woodland Trust. Our students have also pulled together as a team to help maintain a small area of woodland at the school known as 'The Stinger Patch'. In spite of the windy conditions determined students have managed to light fires and enjoy

cinnamon apples at our weekly forest school.

On our work experience, we have been busy preparing our vegetable plot at Nodes Farm and helping with the stabled horses. While East Hoathly Community Garden takes a winter rest, some of our students have also enjoyed helping out at

the Rother Valley Railway at Robertsbridge.

We have developed our measuring skills working on calculating perimeter in the polytunnel and literacy through writing lists of jobs to get ready for the Spring

and our work on explorer Ernest Shackleton in English lessons. In science we have conducted soil texture testing around the site to check suitable areas for planting.






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Headstart Christmas Show
