ASH Term 2 2020-2021

English

- Write an adventure story using a building of local historical interest as a setting. Pupils will make use of all the information collected to add detail to their story, bringing it alive for the reader
- Write non-fiction books linked to their science work on materials
- Make invitations inviting guests to the Unit conclusion event.

Physical Education

- Play competitive games, modified where appropriate

Science

Grouping and Changing Materials- Pupils will learn:

- that there is a range of materials with different characteristics
- that some materials occur naturally and some do not
- the names of some naturally occurring materials
- that some naturally occurring materials are treated (shaped, polished) before they are used
- that objects made from some materials can be altered by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching
- to describe ways of making materials or objects change, using appropriate vocabulary
- to explore materials using appropriate senses and making observations and simple comparisons

Art and Design

- Pupils learn to sew cross-stitch embroidery stitches using original Victorian samplers as inspiration, they will design and sew their own sampler style bookmarks
- Pupils will broaden their understanding of sewing and design.

Mathematics

- Number: Addition and subtraction

- Pupils will look at a range of artefacts including old photographs, paintings, toys, clothes and journal extracts.
- Pupils will also recount text, produce object timelines
